What's An NLEB?

Did you know?

9-10" WINGSPAN

Bats save us **\$ BILLIONS** by eating crop pests

A typical summer colony of 100 bats eats 6 MILLION BUGS over 200 days!

NLEB Habitat



NLEBs like to live in:

Caves & mines called **hibernacula** for winter hibernation

High humidity with no air currents

Summer roosts in cavities, under tree bark, or in tree crevices

In Danger Of Extinction

White Nose Syndrome has already killed 5.5 million bats

Listed as **THREATENED** under the **Endangered Species Act** as of May 4, 2015

Ready To Comply?

U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service now requires NLEB protection

- Obtain NLEB summer habitat info from USFWS
- 2 Conduct a presence/absence survey between May 15 and August 15. HERE'S HOW:
 - STEP 1: Acoustic survey to detect high frequency bat calls
 - STEP 2: Mist-netting & Radio tracking (requires USFWS permitted personnel)
